WSWHE BOCES Announces Regional Child Care Center for Essential Workers

Saratoga Springs, March 25, 2020 – The Washington-Saratoga-Warren-Hamilton-Essex BOCES (WSWHE BOCES) is currently offering child care for the children of essential workers during the COVID-19 emergency at three locations, see below. Each of these locations has two classrooms, one for 3-5 year olds and one for 6-12 year olds. Each classroom will have up to eight students and two staff members. This would equal a total capacity of 48 students. Further expansion is possible, based on additional need.
